Free radon test kits 


⇒ The District of Columbia

Get a "PASSED" 

Residents who have tested their homes for radon with results below EPA's action guideline will received a "PASSED" radon window decal to let the world know their home was tested and "PASSED!"



encourage testing

Window decal may → The District Department of the Environment (DDOE) hopes that these window decals will encourage residents to test their homes for radon. The National Academy of Sciences estimates that radon causes between 15,000 and 22,000 lung cancer deaths each year in the United States, and that 12 percent of all lung cancer deaths are linked to radon.
