Greetings,

The National Exercise Organizer for the Nuclear Energy Agency's Sixth International Nuclear Emergency Exercise (INEX-6), invites players from all levels of government (Federal, State, Local, Tribal, and Territorial), decision makers, regulators, public authorities, and local community organizations to participate in the United States' INEX-6 tabletop exercise (TTX) in-person (or virtually) on March 19-21, 2024, at FEMA Headquarters in Washington, D.C. This TTX allows organizations to participate in a unique international effort with opportunities to provide state and local perspectives rarely seen in similar exercises.

The INEX-6 exercise focuses on the long-term recovery phase of a large-scale radiological incident, which has not been tested before at the international level. INEX-6 will test recovery topics through four modules, incorporating cross-cutting issues during the recovery phase. The exercise is question-driven where participants are challenged to use existing policies, protocols, and emergency preparedness plans/procedures to explain what longer-term protective actions will be taken. It is critical to have Tribal, state, and local jurisdictions participate in the discussions, provide feedback on subject matter expertise, and connect with other attendees.
