**CRCPD** can now distribute this bi-annual memo to you via email **if you so choose.** Email **sbowen@crcpd.org**, **subject "Contacts for Radiological Assistance"** and let us know if you prefer email to a paper memo. The memo will continue to be mailed to everyone that does not contact us.

This edition of the notes is being distributed by CRCPD to 95 interstate shippers and carriers of radioactive material both government and private; the communication centers of both state police and emergency services; each of the agencies listed in the notes; the Canadian and Mexican nuclear safety commissions; the headquarters and regional offices of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, EPA, FEMA and DOE; the DOT PHMSA and modal agencies; U.S. Customs; and to several government and commercial organizations that provide training and guidance on inspection or incidents in transportation.

Air and rail carrier associations, U.S. Customs and DOT modal agencies will wish to copy these notes to member firms and offices that need the information for shipping papers or to obtain assistance with a radiological incident.

So that communications are not overloaded by unwelcome calls during an incident, please do not post this information online or make available for broad distribution.

Shippers and carriers should not use these contacts for radiological assistance as emergency response telephone numbers relative to hazmat entries on shipping papers (per 49 CFR 172.604) without permission of the radiological assistance agency.

Notes on dealing with stray radioactive material and on the use of DOT special permits for scrap or trash found to be radioactive and the DOT special permits and approval forms and the CRCPD directories of commercial services are maintained at <a href="https://www.crcpd.org/">https://www.crcpd.org/</a> under "General," subsections "Commercial Services" "Directories of Commercial Services" and Transportation," Also under "Environmental" subsection "Assistance with Unwanted RAM" and "SCATR Program (Source Collection)" The *immediate action* at a transportation accident involving radioactive material, as recommended by the radiation regulatory agencies and professional associations, is to rescue victims, provide medical attention, extinguish fires, and take reasonable steps to limit the spread of contamination without waiting for a radiological survey (FEMA, 1989).

## Contacts for Radiological Assistance to First Responders at Transportation Incident

CRCPD Notes of March 2025

**Promptly report** an accident involving radioactive materials to one of the following organizations, whose staff can assist with appropriate notifications and requests for assistance to federal, state and professional organizations. If necessary, state police and state emergency services will assist with communications to the scene and to hospitals.

### State Radiation Control Programs

(Refer to spreadsheet)

RCP's, in most situations, can provide radiological advice as well as assistance at the scene of an accident, and they are prepared to assess all types of radioactivity. In most states, the radiation control program has the responsibility for at least the initial radiological assessment of a transportation accident. In general, vehicle operators should notify the state radiation control authority of any incident that delays their progress.

### National Response Center

800/424-8802

This is the sole national point of contact for initial reporting of hazardous material incidents, oil discharges, and biological, etiological or radioactive material releases within U.S.A. and its territories. The National Response Center immediately forwards the report to the designated Federal On-Scene Coordinator and other Federal or State agencies with regulatory or response interest, including EPA (RAD), DOE emergency operations center, and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission operations center. The National Response Center does not provide on-site assistance teams nor advise on incident management.

### U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (via National Response Center)

If requested, the EPA National Response Center will provide monitoring, assessment assistance, and protective action guidance to State or local governments responding to transportation accidents involving radioactive material that is not licensed or owned by another Federal agency or an Agreement State.

### U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Headquarters Operations Center

The Operations Center will provide technical advice, assistance with communications, and assistance in obtaining a radiological assessment team if requested by the principal state or local responder. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has the principal federal responsibility for those radioactive materials that are under licenses issued by the NRC.

### U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Emergency Operations Center

The EOC will provide assistance with communications and arrange for technical advice to emergency responders at a radioactive material transportation incident. DOE will, if requested, provide on-scene radiological assistance to support state and local responders through the local responders through coordination with the appropriate Radiological Assistance Program regions.

Chemtrec and ChemTel provide 24-hour service for general information on the <u>chemicals</u> identified in an accident, as well as communications links to shippers and experts on the particular chemicals involved. They will assist in notifying appropriate government agencies and professional services for radiological assistance. ChemTel has a radiation safety officer on staff. Collect calls are accepted from outside the U.S. for emergency assistance.

Regional Compacts for Radiological Assistance have been formed among most states for assistance with accidents involving radioactive materials.

### Notes

The above agencies prefer that routine incidents with radioactive materials, such as scrap yard portal monitor alarm trips and wet packages of diagnostic nuclear medicines be reported to your State Radiation Control Program. Two pertinent texts are: NCRP Report No. 65, "Management of Persons Accidently Contaminated with Radionuclides," and NCRP Report No. 138, "Management of Terrorist Events Involving Radioactive Materials."

Training is offered at the Oak Ridge Institute: Radiation Emergency Assistance Center/Training Site (REAC/TS) (orau.gov) and the Armed Forces Radiobiology Research Institute AFRRI, Education, MEIR Course (usuhs.edu)

Each federal agency will provide a list of their regional office addresses and telephone numbers for reference, but accidents should be reported to the agency's national operations center. Regional Offices of EPA, FDA and NRC usually do not have radiological assistance staff on duty except during normal business hours.
